





World Mix Boxing Federation Referee Judge & Coaches Certification Course Program Terms :-

The completed signed and dated registration form (Form) and these terms (including any incorporated terms) form a legally binding contract (Agreement) between the person named on the form (you) and World Mix Boxing Federation .

This Agreement sets out the terms on which you apply for, and participate in the coaching, Referee & Judge course as nominated on the form (Course)

1. If you want to participate in the Course , you must .
 - a) Complete all areas on and sign and date the form (Application)
 - b) Pay World Mix Boxing Federation Fees either by cheque or Demand Draft (DD) made payable to “World Mix Boxing Federation ” or by completing the credit and section on the form and
 - c) Send the application together with your payment of the fees to World Mix Boxing Federation

2. World Mix Boxing Federation will not process any Application that does not comply with clause 1

3. If you are successful, World Mix Boxing Federation will notify you in writing using the nominated details from you Form

4. Cancellations after confirmation of your place on the course will be accepted by World Mix Boxing Federation only in exceptional circumstances and on payment of a cancellation fees as follows :-
 - a) Within 2 weeks of start date , cancellation fee is equal to full cost of course.
 - b) 2 – 4 weeks of start date, cancellation fee is 33% of full cost of course.
 - c) Cancellation within 2 weeks of start date, where a medical certificate is provided to prove that your injury prevented, you from attending even the theory modules of the course, will still incur a cancellation fee that is at the discretion of the World Mix Boxing Federation and will reflect all reasonable costs associated with your late withdrawal. It will cover all costs that were incurred due to our anticipation of your arrival on course and may still equal the full cost of course as indicated in section 4(a) above,

5. You must comply with World Mix Boxing Federation Statutes , including the World's Registration regulations, Code of conduct and Disciplinary Regulations.

6. You agree.
 - a) With World Mix Boxing Federation 's interpretation that determinations made by an World Mix Boxing Federation employee that you were successful or unsuccessful in passing the Course does not constitute a Grievance for the purposes of the World Mix Boxing Federation Statutes.
 - b) To otherwise submit exclusively to the jurisdiction of the Grievance Resolution Regulations and not to attempt to resolve any dispute the subject matter of the World Mix Boxing Federation statutes in a court of law .
7. World Mix Boxing Federation may de-register you at any time by written notice, including if these Terms or its incorporated documents are not complied with.
- 8 You understand that there are inherent risk associated with participation in the Course, which may result in personal injury (even of a serious nature) to participants and that you fully accept and agree to bear those risks.
- 9., You agree not to bring any claim or proceeding against any World Mix Boxing Federation for any damage, loss, injury or liability you may suffer in participating in or being excluded from or failing, the Course, Except for liability that by law cannot be excluded, World Mix Boxing Federation excludes all liability to you in tort (including negligence) contract or bailment for acts or omissions of World Mix Boxing Federation and its employees, agents and contractors.
10. World Mix Boxing Federation reserves the right to not award accreditation in situation they deem fair, such as, but not limited to you not attending all modules, of the course, without exception.
11. World Mix Boxing Federation may
 - a) Reject or choose not to accept an Application on its absolute discretion, including non – compliance with eligibility requirements,. Not enough numbers to stage the Course or too many applications for the Course
 - b) Choose not be enforce a term of the Agreement in some cases in its absolute discretion without affecting its right to enforce that term in other cases and
 - c) Change all dates, session times, durations and locations of the Course without notice to you.

RULE: WORLD LEVEL COMPETITIONS

01 In all international tournaments, fighters should be seeded according to ranking or by national title.

02 Each competitors name, country and number must be listed. A minimum of three competitors in each pro weight class is obligatory. Less than three competitors move up to the next higher weight category. In that case each country must get a minimum of **1** copy of all drawing lists and name list of competitors for free. They should get it at least a few hours her discretion.

before the start of the tournament. There is no way to protest after the drawing.

RULE: THE ATTENDANCE OF PHYSICIAN

01 Every match must have a licensed physician in attendance at ringside. Any and all directions and/or orders from the attending physician must be immediately obeyed. A first-aid team is compulsory as well.

02 Every match must also have Emergency Medical Transport with equipment including a backboard and neckbrace.

03 The official physician, who must attend every match, is the final authority in questions of the safety of the competitors, and he or she may at any time stop or terminate a match at his or her discretion.

04 The attending physician must follow the rules and regulations of the appropriate national health board as well as those approved by the authorities where such rules apply.

05 No match may start or proceed before the attending physician is in place, and the physician may not leave his or her place prior to the decision in the last match.

06 The attending physician shall be ready to assist if a serious emergency arises, and to administer first aid in the event of less serious injuries.

07 The doctor has the right to interrupt or stop a contest by ringing the bell or calling ‘‘stop’’ to the referee, if he or she thinks a competitor is in danger and the referee has not stopped the fight. He or she is also responsible for making the decision when a referee calls him or her in case of an injury to a competitor.

08 No one, even a competitor's second, may attempt to aid a competitor during a round before the attending physician has had the opportunity to see the injured competitor. If the doctor enters the ring, he or she must examine the presumed injury and then decide whether or not the fight should continue. The doctor's examinations must take place inside the ring and must have duration of not more examination must take place inside the ring and must have duration of not more than one minute. Any kind of treatment of the competitor is forbidden. Should one minute be insufficient, the referee shall stop the match and declare the injured competitor's opponent the winner. Doctor's decisions are final, although they can be protested if a second doctor is present at the event. The second doctor will make the decision about the protest.

RULE: ROUND NUMBER AND LENGTH

01 In tournaments, all preliminary and final matches shall consist of no more than three (3) rounds of not more than two (2) minutes each with a one (1) minute break between rounds.

02 In all other events, matches shall consist of no more than five (5) two (2) minute rounds with a one (1) minute break between rounds.

03 Regional, national, and international title matches shall consist of five (5) two (2) minute rounds.

RULE ATTIRE

01 Semi contact / light contact. Competitors shall wear short trousers mix boxing dress code. Males shall be wear any upper body covering. Females must wear a sports or athletic top or bra.

02 For Mixboxing and **K-1**, competitors shall wear shorts. Females must wear a sports or athletic top or bra.

03 Males must wear mixboxing dress code.

04 Rear (reverse) kicks to the body or the head, as well as spinning back kicks to the body and to the head.

05 front foot sweeps and back foot sweeps.

01 The following techniques are legal for mixboxing.

(1) All forms of boxing in combination with kicks above the waist to the body and the head.

(2) Rear (reverse) kicks to the body or the head, as well as spinning back kicks to the body and to the head.

(3) Your body lock back side must be layed.

(4) Low kicks to the things, inside and outside.

02 The following techniques are legal for: mixboxing

- (1) All forms of boxing in combination with kicks above the waist to the body and the head.
- (2) Rear (reverse) kicks to the body or the head, as well as spinning back kicks to the body and to the head.
- (3) Low kicks to the thighs, inside and outside.
- (4) Knee attacks to the body, as well as kicks with the shin to the thighs, body and the head
- (5) Clinching (holding) for **3** seconds and attacking at the same time with knees and or any strikes.
- (6) Jumping kicks not allow but all style kicks allowed.
- (7) Kicking catch and body catch not allowed.

03 The following techniques are legal in original WBM MIXBOXING rules (K-1):

- (1) All forms of boxing in combination with kicks above the waist to the body and the head
- Cases the second shall step onto the ring apron to signal that his or her competitor gives up.

04 Victory by the referee stopping a contest (RSC):

- (1) The referee may stop a match if a competitor is clearly outmatched or if he or she is a hazard to his or her own safety according to the following guidelines:
 - (a) If the referee believes that a competitor is clearly overmatched and will face unnecessary punishment in the ring, the match should not be allowed to go on.
 - (b) If a referee judges that a competitor is unable to continue the match due to injuries or for any other physical reasons, the referee must stop the match and call the official doctor to the ring. No referee may decide how seriously a competitor is injured; the referee must call the doctor.

05No contest (NC):

- (1) A match may be stopped immediately by the referee before the prescribed time due to circumstance beyond the control of the competitors or the referee:
 - (a) The safety equipment of the ring has been damaged.
 - (b) The ring is unsafe for use.
 - (c) The lighting over the ring is failing.
 - (d) Weather conditions force the referee to stop the match.
- (2) Under such circumstances the match shall be stopped and a “no contest” match shall be declared with no winner.

06 Victory by walk-over (WO):

- (1) If one competitor is present in the ring ready to fight and his or her opponent fails to show after his or her name has been called over the loudspeaker, the referee shall signal the referee's table to begin the running of two minutes. If the opponent has not entered the ring within the two minute time limit, the timekeeper shall strike the gong to signal that the match has been stopped. The referee shall then announce the competitor who was first in the ring and declare him or her the winner by "walk-over".
- (2) The judges shall note this on their scorecards, which shall then be collected. The judges shall then summon the competitor who has won by walk-over to the center of the ring, and after the announcement of the decision, raise his or her hand and declare him or her the winner

RULE WARNINGS AND MINUS POINTS

01 In case of a serious violation, the referee shall stop the fight with the command "stop" and issue a warning. The warning shall be issued clearly and in such a manner that the offending competitor understands the reason for the warning. The referee shall clearly indicate which competitor has received the warning by pointing his or her hand. Following a warning the referee shall let the match proceed by commanding "fight".

02 If an official warning was given because of a foul, no point shall be deducted, but the judges shall immediately give this competitor a "first warning". If a competitor has received a "second warning" because of a foul, no point shall be deducted, but the judges shall immediately give this competitor a "second warning". Should a competitor received three warning in one match, he or she

MIX BOXING : THE COMPETITION AREA :-

The competition area will be matted square of a W.M.B.,F. approved type with sides of eight metres measured from the outside with an additional two metres on all sides as a safety area . There will be a clear safety area of two metres on each side.

- Small size 20 feet (6.10 metres)
- Large size 24 feet (7.30 metres)

MIX BOXING : RING ACCESSORIES :-

The following equipment is required at ringside

- 1) Break area at both corners
- 2) Two drinking water bottles and two spray bottles . No other type of bottles is allowed ringside.
- 3) Two towels
- 4) Two bowls of water
- 5) Tables and chairs for the officials
- 6) Alarm bell
- 7) One or two stop clocks
- 8) Score sheets
- 9) Locking box for keeping the score sheets
- 10) One set of round indicators, signs or boards
- 11) Two pairs of spare boxing gloves
- 12) One spare set each of red and blue boxing shorts
- 13) Groin protector with one or two ties
- 14) Two cloth squares to facilitate groin protector change or adjustment.
- 15) Stretcher
- 16) Blunt edged scissors

MIX BOXING : THE BOXING GLOVES

Only Gloves certified by world mix Boxing Federation are allowed to be used in any all style match

Boxing Glove requirements : Gloves usage should correspond to the following weight divisions :-

Weight Division - Glove weight

Mini Flyweight - Junior Featherweight 6 ounce (132 grams)

Featherweight - Welterweight 8ounce (227 grams)

Junior Middle weight and upwards 10 ounce (284 grams)

The weight of the leather shall not be more than half of the total gloves weight , including the internal cushioning , which should always be in good condition . The laces are to be tied at the back of the wrist band.

To ensure compliance with the regulations, all gloves will be inspected by a member of the match committee prior to the fight.

MIX BOXING : BANDAGES

Only a soft material type is allowed , size 2 inches x 6.5yards (5 cm x 6 metres) Plastic or plaster types are strictly prohibited. The use of adhesive tape size 2.50 cm x 2.50 metres is only allowed for covering the back of the wrist and must not be used to cover the knuckles

MIX BOXING : OFFICIAL DRESS CODE

- Contestants and their coaches must wear the official uniforms as herein defined.
- The Referee commission may disbar any official or competitor who does not comply with this regulation.

MIX BOXING : JUDGE /REFEREE DRESS

Referee and Judges must wear the official uniform and designated by the Referee commission Thi uniform must be worn at all tournaments and courses

The official uniform will be as follows :-

- A)
- B) Single breasted navy blue blazer
- C) Navy Blue Pant
- D) White Shirt
- E) Red Tie

A BOXER ATTIRE

- 1) Only boxing shorts are to be worn the colour of which depending on the corner, red , pink or maroon or with a red stripe for the red corner , blue, bright blue, black for the blue corner, The dressing gown will be as specified by World Mix boxing Federation
 - 2) To ensure the boxer's safety, a groin protector must be worn and tied only at the back
 - 3) Long hair and/or beards are prohibited. A short moustache is allowed but the hair must not extend over the lip.
 - 4) The Mongkol should be worn when performing the WaiKr (paying respect to one's teacher) prior to the match start. Amulets are only to be worn on the arm or waist and covered by material to avoid injury.
 - 5) Single elastic bandage are allowed to be worn on the arm or legs to prevent sprains however insertion of a shin guard etc. is not allowed
 - 6) No Mentalized material, , decoration or jewellery are allowed to be worn
 - 7) The use of Vaseline, fat or any similar substance by the boxer to gain unfair advantage is not allowed
 - 8) Boxer may wear elastic ankle bandage to protect his feet.
- B. Any infringement to the dress code may result in the fighter's disqualification in the case of any problem with the boxing gloves themselves , the referee may temporarily halt the match until they are corrected

MIX BOXING : EVENT STYLE S

Semi , Light , Full contact / Professional Sub – Junior under 14 yrs (Semi contact)

- 1) Semi Junior under 14 yrs (Semi contact)
 - a) Complete equipment with chest guard
 - b) Dress Code – Boxing Kit
 - c) Attacks – Knee punch kick are allowed
 - d) Rounds – two rounds , each of 1 minute and 30 seconds rest between them
 - e) On Paper / Score sheet
- 2) Junior under 17 years (Light Contact)
 - a) Dress code – Boxing Dress (shorts & sando) colour red & Blue
 - b) Equipments – All equipments without chest guard
 - c) Round 3 rounds of two minute and 30 seconds rest between them
 - d) Point scoring – on Score sheet
- 3) Senior under 19 years
 - a) Dress code – only shorts (For girls round neck T Shirts also)
 - b) Equipments –Complete guard Chest / Thais/elbow/face guard, knee guard, gloves, gum shield
 - c) Round 3 rounds of two minute and 30 seconds rest between them
 - d) Final Fight – 3 rounds f 3 minutes and 1 minute rest between them
 - e) Result On score sheet

MIX BOXING : ROUND DEFINITION AND MIX BOXERS

- 1) Before and after a bout the mix boxer will shake hands / touch gloves as a sign of a purely sporting and friendly rivalry , according to mix boxing regulations. Handshake takes place before starting the first round and after the decision. No handshakes is allowed between the rounds.

MIX BOXING : SCORING PRACTICE

The standard scoring practice is as follows :-

A A strike either by a punch , kick, knee or sheipe

- Scoring from a strike
- Points will be awarded for a correct Mix boxing style, combined with hard and accurate strikes.
- Points will be awarded for aggressive and dominating Mix boxing skill.
- Points will be awarded for a fighter actively dominating his opponent.
- Points will be awarded for the use of a traditional Mix boxing style of defense and counter attack.
- Points will be deducted from a boxer who fouls or break the rules.

2 **Non Scoring strikes**

1. A strike which is against the rules
2. A strike in defense against the leg or arm of an opponent
- 3 A weak strike

B **Fouls**

1. The judge will deduct points for any foul as directed by the referee.
2. Any foul observed by the judges but not by the referee will be penalized accordingly.

C **Method of Scoring**

1. The maximum score of each round is 20 points, the loser scoring either 19 – 15
2. A drawn round will be scored as 20 points for both boxers.
3. The winner and loser in an indecisive round will score 20 -19 respectively
4. The winner and loser in decisive round will score 20 -18 respectively
5. The winner and loser in an indecisive round with a single count, will score 20 – 18 respectively
6. The winner and loser in a decisive round with a single count, will score 20 – 17 respectively.
7. The boxer scoring 2 counts against his opponent will score 20.17
8. Any boxer who commits a foul will have points deducted from his score

INTERNATIONAL OFFICIAL POINTS RULES

- 1) Front Swipe (2 point)
- 2) Back swipe (2 Point)
- 3) Back Mauwasi Girl (Kick) (2 Point)
- 4) Knee Kick (chest) (1 point)
- 5) Face Paunch (1 Point) (Paunch on systematic Technique)
- 6) Chest Paunch (1 Point)
- 7) All Kick only face (1 Point)
- 8) Laap kick (1 Point)
- 9) Jump kick not allowed
- 10) Centre Kick not allowed (Wick Point)
- 11) Body catching now allowed
- 12) Pushing not allowed
- 13) Elbow not allowed

MIX BOXING : SECONDS

Two seconds are allowed to attend the boxer as per the following stipulations :-

- 1) During the match, the seconds are not allowed to advice, help or instruct their boxer, Any violation of the rules by the seconds or the boxer may result in the boxer disqualification.
- 2) The seconds are not allowed to signal to interested parties , the condition of his boxer.
- 3) During the match , the seconds must stay in the designated area. Prior to the start of each round they will remove all towels, water bottles, etc out of the ring area
- 4) During the interval, the seconds will ensure that their boxer is properly attired . In case of any problem they shall inform the referee immediately .

MIX BOXING : MATCH COMMITTEE

A Committee Member's Qualification

1. No physical disability and at least 25 years old.
2. Hold a medical certificate endorsed by the World Mix boxing Federation.
3. Hold proper certification as to their work experience health, age and occupation .
4. Certified by the World Mix boxing Federation as properly qualified.

B Referee's Qualification

- 1 All referees must be trained and tested by the appropriate committee of the World Mix boxing Federation and be certified and registered as a referee.
2. Not over 60 years of age unless an extension is approved by the committee.
- 3 Must resign immediately on the order of the committee or when unable to perform his duties,.

C Number of Judges and Referees

The match committee will comprises of 3 judges and one referee for the ring with the match chairman responsible for match supervision.

MIX BOXING : THE REFEREE & JUDGES PANEL

A Duty

The prime duty of the referee is to ensure the safety of the boxers to the maximum degree.

B The Referee's Responsibility

The Referee's uniform will consist of blue trousers and shirt , bearing the logo of the World Mix boxing Federation and flat Canvas shoes. No glasses o jewellery are allowed. The referee shall ensure the following

- 1) Fairness in the application of the rules and regulations to all parties.
- 2) No impoliteness in manner or speech either to the boxers or the audience.
- 3) Close supervision of the match
- 4) Protection of a weaker fighter against serious injury.
- 5) Inspection of the boxing gloves and anklets.

- 6) Ensure both boxers shake hands prior to the first and final rounds.
- 7) For a championship or title defense fight, the referee must inform the boxers and their seconds of the rules and regulations governing the fight and this is to be done in the dressing room, prior to the fight itself.
- 8) Three verbal orders are recognized,
 - “STOP” when ordering the boxers to stop fighting .
 - “BREAK” when ordering the boxers to separate.
 - “FIGHT” when ordering the boxers to continue the match. When the boxers are ordered to “BREAK” both must step back one step before continuing to fight.
- 9) The referee shall use the correct signal to ensure boxer’s understanding of any rule infringement.
- 10) At the match end, he will collect the score sheets from each of the three judges and indicate the winner to the audience by raising that boxer’s hand. The score sheets will then be handed to the chairman for verification.
- 11) For a championship match , the referee will collect the score sheet from the judge at the end of each round , inspect and submit them to the chairman in addition to raising the winner’s hand after the result announcement.
- 12) Should it be necessary to stop the match or penalize a boxer, he will immediately advise the reason to the committee chairman after making the announcement .
- 13) In case of an accident to the referee which prevents him from continuing the senior judge will act on his behalf.
- 14) The referee is forbidden to give a verbal count or warning that gives either an unfair advantage or disadvantage to any fighter.
- 15) He is forbidden to comment or speculate on any match unless receiving prior approval from the committee chairman .
- 16) All referees are subjected to a yearly medical inspection and certification by the doctor of the Federation and must be physically fit at the start of any match

C. Referee’s Duties

1. To stop the match immediately if he considers that one boxer is significantly more skilled or stronger than the other.
2. To stop the match immediately when a boxer is in difficulties or is injured.
3. To stop the match immediately if he considers that one or both fighters are faking or not trying their best.

4. To stop the match or warn the boxer for committing a foul or breaking the rules.
5. To immediately disqualify a boxer who defiantly breaks the rules injures or shows any aggression to the referee.
6. To disqualify both the boxers and his seconds if his seconds deliberately break the rules or do not follow his directions.
7. To disqualify any boxer who intentionally or accidentally cause foul.
8. To stop the match if he consider that a boxer having received account is unable to effectively continue the match
- 9 To disallow any advantage to a boxer who intentionally fouls in any way.

D Rules Infringement Warnings

Prior to giving a warning for rule infringement , the referee shall stop the fight, use the correct warning signal to ensure the boxer understanding and then indicate the offending boxer to the judges . Any boxer, who is so indicated or warned 3 times or more, may be disqualified , in the event of a serious rule infringement , the referee's decision is final

- i) For greifing , holding and throw
- ii) Without equipments.
- iii) For bad gestures within the fight
- iv) When a player is not fighting in a proper manner
- v) No mental substance is allowed.

E The Purpose of a Warning

The purpose of warning is to advice or warn any boxer not to break the rules during the fight.

F Count Procedure for a mix boxer Falling Out of the Area

- 1) If a boxer falls through the ring ropes, the referee shall order his opponent to stand in the other corner and if the boxer remains outside the ropes, the referee shall start to count (A count to 10)
- 2) A boxer falls out of the ring ,the referee shall count to 20 (20 seconds)

When a fall out take place the referee will start counting , however if the boxer returns to the ring before the count ends, he will not be penalized.
- 3) If any one prevents the fallen boxer from returning to the ring, the referee shall warn such person or stop the fight if he continues his action

- 4) If both boxers fall out of the ring the referee shall start counting. If one boxer tries to prevent his opponents from returning to the ring before the count ends he will be warned or disqualified.
- 5) If both boxers fall out of the ring, the referee shall start counting, the one that returns to the ring before the count ends, will be considered the winner. If neither boxer can return to the ring the result will be considered a draw.

MIX BOXING : FINAL AUTHORITY DECISION

The chairman of the match committee may authorize a correction to the final result as follows :-

- 1) If the referee makes a decision significantly contrary to the normal rules and practice.
- 2) If it is discovered that the judge has made a conspicuous score sheet error

MIX BOXING : CHAIRMAN'S DUTIES

- 1) To appoint the referee and judge for each match and promotion
- 2) To monitor and improve the standards of the referee and judges and ensuring conformity to the rules and standard practice
- 3) To verify the referee and judges perform their duty and responsibilities and to advise the World Mix boxing Federation if any irregularity takes place,.
- 4) To solve any prior problem regarding the promotion reporting the result to the Federation Committee.
- 5) Make the decision to the referee and the judges
- 6) To verify the score sheet to ensure that
 - a) The score has been allied correctly
 - b) The name of the fighters are correct
 - c) The correct winner has been named
 - d) To authenticate the score sheet and inspect the score
 - e) To announce the result of the match to the audience
- 7) To make any decision in case that the referee or judge could not continue.
- 8) To report to the Federation committee the name of any boxer who violates the rules or shows poor performance.

MIX BOXING : TIME KEEPER AND ANNOUNCER

A Setting for the time keeper and announcer will be located next to the ring

B Duties And Responsibilities

The timekeeper must keep precisely the timing of each round and the breaks, following the referee's instructions to start or stop. The following procedure are to be used

1. A five second warning is to be given prior to the start
Of each round , to enable the seconds to clear the ring.
2. A bell is used to signal the start and end of each round
3. To deduct the break time as per the references instructions.
4. Ensure all timings are correct by using both a watch and stop clock.
5. In the case of a boxer receiving the count during rounds 1 – 4 and the round time ends (3 minutes) the bell should be rung immediately after the referee finishes the count and order the boxer to continue.
6. In the final round , the bell should be rung immediately when the round timing passes 3 minutes , even if the referee is still coming.

C Announcer's Duties

1. To announce the fighter's name corner and weight prior to the fight and again as the boxers arrive in the ring.
2. To order the seconds to leave the ring when the bell rings.
3. To announce the round number at the start and finish of each round,.
4. To announce the winner's name and corner , when the referee raises the boxer's hand

MIX BOXING : FOULS AND STRIKES VIOLATING THE RULES

1. Biting , eye gouging , spitting , or head hutting
2. Wrestling back or arm locks or any similar judo or wrestling hold.
3. Deliberately falling on his opponent
4. Holding the rope for any reason
5. Swearing or the use of abusive language during the match

6. Knocking out or injuring his opponent after the referee has ordered the match to stop for any reason.
7. Deliberately striking the groin area , To be penalized by the deduction of 1 point each time committed. A boxer who has been hit in the groin, may request minute break before continuing match.

MIX BOXING : KNOCK DOWN

1. Definition

- Any part of the body touching the floor except the feet
 - Learning against the ropes in a state of anxiousness
 - Knocked out of the ring
 - Inability to defend himself
2. During account , the referee will direct the opposing boxer to stand in the opposite corner. If he does not, the referee shall stop the count until he does so and it continue. The match will not continue until directed by the referee.
 3. The count interval will be at 1 second intervals from 1 to 10. During the count, the referee will signal , with his hand, to ensure that the boxer receiving the count understand.
 4. A boxer an receiving a count, cannot continue the match prior to a count of 8 and has immediately on receiving a count of 10.
 5. If both boxers fall down the referee will direct the count to the last one that fell . If boxers receive a 10 count , a draw will be declared. Should be boxers can against each other whilst sitting up, the referee will stop counting at that time.
 6. If one of the boxer subsequently falls down again, the referee will continue the count.
 7. A boxer not ready to fight again , after a break when the bell rings , will receive count , unless caused by a problem with his attire

MIX BOXING : MEDICAL INSPECTION

1. All boxers will be certified by the doctor prior to the start of any fight and must be suffering from any sickness or exhibit any prohibited symptom or disease, as specified in the medical manual of the Federation
2. Any boxer due to fight in a foreign country , will be physically examined by a doctor appointed by the Federation Committee He must also confirm to the medical regulations of that country.

MIX BOXING : PROCEDURE AFTER A KNOCK OUT OR TECHNICAL KNOCK OUT

1. If a boxer knocked unconscious or injured, only the doctor and the referee are allowed in the ring . Any other may only enter at the doctors discretion.
2. A boxer losing by a K.O. or T.K.O. will be immediately treated and undergo a physical examination by the doctor.
3. Recovery Period – After a match , a boxer is required to rest for a minimum of 21 days prior to fighting again , with the following exceptions.
 - a) A winner in the first round is required to rest a minimum of 7 days prior to his next fight.
 - b) The winner in third round is required to rest a minimum of 14 days prior to his next fight
4. A boxer losing by T.K.O. or K.O. must rest for a minimum of 30 days prior to his nest fight
5. A boxer specified under item 23.3.1. – 23.3.3 must be examined by the doctor at the ned of each fight, who will then specify his rest period.

MIX BOXING : INTERPRETATION

The chairman or Referee will have the final decision on the interpretation or on any item not covered under these rules and regulations

CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHIES MEDALS

Each category Medals

- i) 1 Gold
- ii) 1 Silver
- iii) 2 Bronze

Each category Trophy

- i) Junior
- ii) Sub – Junior
- iii) Senior

PROTESTS

If a team want to protest result the Chief Referee must receive it in written form within 15 minutes after the fight. The written protest must describe clearly the problem. The Referee must deliver the protest to the Appeals board/ Referee Committee which will also consider the problem. The protest will be handled immediately.

1) Irregular Protest

Irregular protest resulting from disapproval of decision, where fighter protest by delaying the regular continuation of the program in the ring /tatami, such as sitting down in the ring /tatami whether decided from himself or provoked by his coach/team, will be reacted upon by the Referee committee or by the Board of Directors directly. As a consequence the entire team of the discipline can be excluded. If security staff have to intervene and/or in case of physical conflict due to this action, the entire national team in question can be immediately.

A protest will only be handled in response in a written letter and a protest will not be handled if the above mentioned action take place.
